The pavilion will be open at **7.30am** to receive exhibits.

Judging to begin at **9.30am**

Entries are to be collected between **3.00pm** and **4.00pm**. This will be done under supervision of the stewards.

Exhibitors in sections A, B, C, D and E must be made or grown by the exhibitor.

If in the opinion of the judge an exhibit is incorrectly classed it may be removed by the steward and placed in the correct class.

All persons entering this section must reside within 60kms of Neville.

SECTION A OPEN - FLORAL ART & DECORATIVE

Entries in this section to be arranged by the exhibitor, but blooms need not be grown by the exhibitor.

The judge will consider originality, design, condition of plant material used, scale, balance, suitability of container & focal point. No ribbons to be used, oasis & wire allowable but should be disguised.

Accessories and embellishments allowed.
